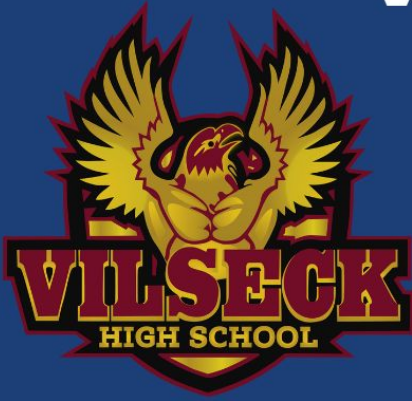

DoDEA Online Summer High School Commitment Agreement 14 June-24 July 2024

Sponsors and students should return this signed agreement to their local school counselor before registering for a summer school course.

The DVHS offers a fast-paced summer school program designed to provide eligible, military-connected students with the opportunity to earn a semester credit (5) in approximately six weeks. Before enrolling in a DVHS summer school course, students and sponsors acknowledge the following:

Pacing

Our courses are not self-paced:

1. Eighteen weeks of schoolwork are compressed into a six-week summer school session. One day of summer schoolwork is the equivalent of three days of regular work. Because of this, missing one week of class (five days) during summer school is the equivalent of missing three weeks of class (15 days) during the regular school year.
2. Students are expected to follow the daily course assignment schedule due dates posted in each course even while on vacation or attending a camp or other such activity. Our late work policy is outlined below.
3. Modules, units, assignments, projects, quizzes, tests, or exams cannot be opened early.
4. Students must complete all work by midnight on the final day of the course—extensions cannot be provided.

Attendance and the Assignment Schedule

Attendance is taken every time a student logs in to their course and submits their work:

1. Course materials are available to students at any time on any day via an internet connection.
2. Students must have daily access to a computer or laptop with a strong internet connection throughout the summer.
3. Students are expected to log in to their course and work on their assignments each weekday, Monday through Friday, for 2-4 hours each day.
4. Students should continue to follow their assignment schedule's due dates while on vacation, attending a camp, or any other special program or activity. Our late work policy is outlined below.
5. **Late Work Policy:** Work must be submitted on time according to the individual course assignment schedule (posted in each course). Work submitted after the due date will receive a 15% reduction. Work submitted after the unit or module closes will receive a 20% reduction. Work will be accepted up to two weeks after the due date. Work submitted after two weeks will receive a 0. **No work can be accepted after midnight on the final day of class.**

Academic Integrity

As outlined in the Student Orientation, students are expected to always uphold academic integrity. Cheating of any kind, to include the use of AI, will result in a 0. Further information on the DVHS Academic Integrity Policy is embedded in each course.

2024 Summer School Essentials for High School Students and Sponsors

Summer School Schedule: Approximately three days of class material is covered each day.

Date	Event
June 14-July 24	Start and finish dates for summer school. Students are expected to actively participate in the course every weekday, but course material is available to students 24/7. Absences are discouraged and should be discussed with the DoDEA Virtual High School (DVHS) administration before beginning the course.
June 12	Date students will receive a welcome letter to include login information and summer school policies and deadlines—this will be sent to both the sponsor's email in ASPEN (DoDEA's Student Information System) and the student's Google email (see below). Sponsors should update contact information with their local school before this date.
June 13	All high school courses will open at 1700 EDT. Students will use their Google email to log in to their course. A course-specific assignment schedule with required due dates is provided in each course.
June 21	Students who fail to complete the Course Orientation and the first three days of work noted on their course assignment schedule by 1500 EDT will be administratively withdrawn the following day. Reinstatement is not possible. No record of attendance will appear on the official student transcript.
June 21	For students who choose to withdraw from the course by 1500 EDT, no official grade will appear on the transcript. Please use this form for withdrawal request: https://forms.office.com/r/8Wx4ukX6aV
June 28	Students who choose to withdraw from the course between 1500 EDT on 21 June and 1500 EDT on 28 June will receive a WP or WF on their official student transcript. Please use this form for withdrawal requests: https://forms.office.com/r/f52Gf96waV . Students still enrolled in the course after 1500 EDT on 28 June will receive a final grade on their official transcript.
July 24	All final coursework—to include quizzes, tests, and exams—must be submitted by midnight on this date. Work submitted after this date will not be graded. Extensions cannot be granted for the summer school session.

2024 Technical Requirements for Students and Sponsors

Students are required to use **Google Chat**, the instant messaging system used by DoDEA and the DVS. Students and teachers will use it for instant communication during the teacher's office hours or by appointment.

To complete a course with the DVHS, students must have access to the following (at a minimum):

- 1) Daily access to high-speed broadband/internet (at least 3-4 hours per day).
- 2) A laptop computer or PC. Assignments cannot be submitted to Schoology using a phone or tablet.
- 3) A DoDEA Google School Apps account (####@student.dodea.edu). This account is generated when students are enrolled in ASPEN upon local school registration. For further information, contact your local school education technologist or counselor, or submit a Help Desk ticket (see below).
- 4) An Internet Browser (the most current version): Google Chrome (preferred), Internet Explorer, Mozilla Firefox, or Safari.
- 5) **Suggested:** Headphones and a mic to speak directly to the instructor.

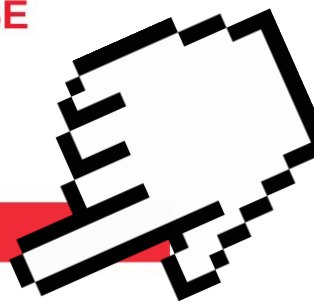

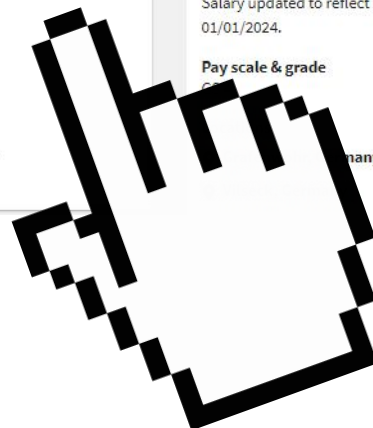

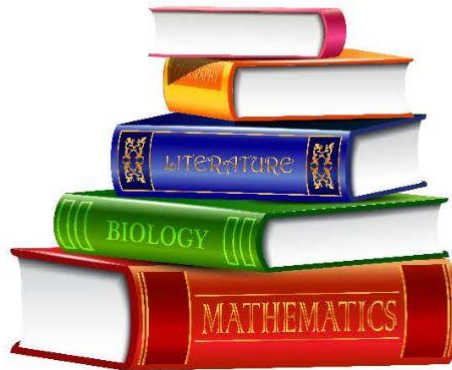
