- March 18 SAT testing completed (1 of 103 not tested) - scores due April 2026

- 2026-2027 master scheduling completed (88% of student requests met)

### • Seniors driving graduation events





- Communicated early & often
- Timeline parameters of grade reporting into Aspen by teachers. Are other grading platforms used?
  - Dr. Davis: Official gradebook in Aspen
    - Some teachers may grade individual assignments in Google Classroom or Schoology
    - One meaningful grade is required to be entered in Aspen weekly
      - Please reach out to teacher if this is not being observed
      - If questions remain, contact administration (Dr. Davis or Ms. Travers)
- Additional insights on D/F reporting. Accidental emails sent reporting D/F status to parents.
  - “Nudge” letters are automatically sent out, however, please keep them for now
- Due to the behavior health changes, what impact will this have on the high school next year.
  - EUSARAC & DOWEA are trying to reinstate Behavioral Health Staff ASAP
    - Need to collect data to substantiate
  - Any additional updates to the school infrastructure forecast for the next fiscal year.
    - Hiring school counselor
    - Hiring multi-lingual/ELA teacher
    - Selected Special Education teacher to fill current vacancy
    - Paraeducators are nearly staffed (awaiting official offers)
    - Culinary Arts program to begin 2026-2027 - new hire expected
    - Reregistration is currently occurring, please encourage registration ASAP
      - Registrar working through enrollment
      - ~136 incoming 9th graders

### VIII. Open Forum

- Teen Health Clinic requested to be reinstated ASAP - timeline TBD
  - legal also being consulted
- Volunteering cord available?
  - For 2026 graduation, no additional cords/stoles
  - District plan coming forward - will be mandated/limited
    - tied to charters/nationally recognized organizations
    - GPA cords will phase out
    - Dr. Davis to bring to attention of District
- Concern with respect to coaching for D1 level
  - uneven distribution of skill/experience level WRT official coach/sponsor
    - DOWEA must hire coaches from TP (full time staff), then substitute teachers
  - all coaches must complete training
  - volunteerism is most appreciated
    - must be vetted by administration
    - encourage soldier volunteers
- recruitment is challenging
  - tours participated in at Stuttgart
